1. Child Line

CHILDLINE 1098 is a phone number that spells hope for millions of children across India. It is a 24-hour a day, 365 days a year, free, emergency phone service for children in need of aid and assistance. We not only respond to the emergency needs of children but also link them to relevant services for their long-term care and rehabilitation. This year we received 510 calls from Children side. This year, we covered 18,215 Girl children, 16,565 male children, 10,456 men and 16,983 women, totally 32,214 persons covered in various activities of Childline. 2. Student Development Centers

NAMCO has been organizing 36 Student Development centers at three districts as Nagapattinam, Thiruvarur and Cuddalore districts, where 1240 poor students are being benefited. The critical situation of COVID 19, NAMCO has made home visits only and distributed relief materials to all students' family and also distributed health safety materials including mask, soaps, sanitizer, etc. Due to Government guidelines, NAMCO made one to one interaction only with students. Teachers of SDC made awareness on COVID-19 to all families related to SDC.

3. Sponsorship Programme for Poor Students

The programme aims to support poor and marginalized students for their higher studies. To minimize dropouts from higher studies and motivate poor and marginalized brilliant students to achieve their goal, SEEEDS, Hope 3 Foundation, & Shooting Stars Foundation, USA are supporting the students through NAMCO for their college fees. This year we have supported for 337 Students in all.

4. Integrated Home for Destitute children and Old age people, Nagapattinam

The main objective of the Scheme is to improve the quality of life of the Older Persons and orphan, semi-orphan and poor children by providing basic amenities like shelter, food, medical care and entertainment opportunities and by encouraging productive and active ageing.

At present these homes shelter 21 children and 25 elders. The home provides food, shelter, education, opportunities for skill development and talent promotion in an atmosphere of love and care.

5. Old Age Home

Accommodating twenty five (25) elders who have no living children or support from children or their own family or not having any source of income, in a modest home in Keezhaiyur, Nagapattianm district. The home provides free food, dress, medical facilities, shelter, etc. Keeping our elders engaged in proactively involved and keeping them physically and mentally lively and it fosters a strong bond among residents as they take it upon themselves to look after each other's well-being. We also encourage the talents of the elders by conducting regular music, yoga, tailoring & dance classes.

6. Elders Support Programme

The programme is like a day care center for elders. Non- residential elders come to the centers and use their leisure time with their peers. Center has newspapers, provides butter milk or tea, magazines, books, etc. The center has Television with cable connection to entertain elders. NAMCO has two elders support programmes at Nagapattinam and Thiruvarur.

7. Promotion of Farmer Producer Organisation (FPO)

NAMCO had organized two women SHG federations with the result of Women SHG Programme with NABARD. With help of women federations, baseline survey was made on livelihoods to promote Farmers Producers Organisation. Baseline line reports reveals that majority of woman are engaged with milk animals and Jasmine cultivations. NAMCO made one to one intervention and one to group intervention succeed to promote NAMCO Suyambu Farmers Producer Organisation with NABARD and registered. The board members were given various training on management, marketing, account keeping, etc. they have undergone exposure trainings to Honey bee Keeping farm, Pantrutti, Farmers Producer companies at Keeranur, Pudukottai, and Organic agricultural farm, Vanagam, Karaur, (It is training centre and blessed by "Iyarkai Vingani NAMMAZHVAR". The Farm is a model to the organic farming farmers of Tamilnadu,) Ammaiyar Milk company at Karaikkal, etc with support of NABARD. Aftermath of all trainings and exposure visits, they have started business with profits. Separate office was setup for producer Organisation.

8. Common Service Center (Gram Dugan)

The main objectives Gram Dukan are to make marketing networks in and around the villages for the tiny and small producers associations and women SHG products, To give knowledge and services to the tiny and small producers association and women SHG products and By making Gram Dukan as value added products and increase the income of the poor and marginal women and farmers. With support of NABARD, NAMCO has initiated Gram Dukan at Maruthur village of Vedaranyam block of Nagapattinam district with a common Service Center for the Milk Producers.

9. LEDP (Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme)

Main livelihood activity of Nagapattinam district is agriculture which gives seasonal jobs to landless people and land owners are also living without income. Moreover, the district is prone to multiple disasters. To boosting their income and also alternative income, NAMCO has organized micro entrepreneur trainings to women with support of NABARD. The reporting year, NAMCO organized trainings as Honey Bee keeping and vermin-compost training to 90 women and Milk value added products making training to 30 women Famers.

10. Micro Credit Programme

LARAKSHA Social Impact Trust has been supporting to repair or construct new roof on loan basis for the target people of NAMCO. The reporting year, we facilitated to provide loan distribution to 60 beneficiaries.

STDH Revolving Fund Programme –Part of empowering women in rural areas, NAMCO organized Revolving Fund program with STdH. NAMCO distributed -50, 65,000 amounts as revolving fund for women self-help groups (SHGs). We have reached 175 women members during the reporting period. It is a continuing project. Out of the impact, we planned to do some social activities for the children and their families as Evening Tuition centres, Medical support etc., from the coming finac9ial year

With help of Opportunity Micro Finance India (OMI), NAMCO support its WSHG members to do small business. Under the programme, 69 Women members are benefited and 20, 70,000 amounts were distributed.

11. Capacity building and training programme

 With support of Green light planet CSR programme, NAMCO organized 12 batches of entrepreneurship training programmes for 350 SHG members in 12 batches, and 100 leaders on capacity building training in 3 batches at Vedaranyam taluk. Each batch has 30 beneficiaries for two days and totally 450 women were trained in 15 batches.

12. COVID 19 Response & Charity Programme

Direct impacts are addressed by Government through medical treatments and most of poor people were indirectly affect by COVID19 by losing their wages. Government made long period lockdown without making preparedness. NAMCO with its strength did relief works in its working areas. They were as follows

13. Programmes with NANBAN Foundation

- NAMCO and NANBAN Foundation helped 302 bags of rice (7550kg) to Dharma Salais/Sangams located in Salem, Dharmapuri, Namakkal, Karur, Erode and Thiruvallur districts for people who lost job through COVID-19 pandemic. And, 80 bags broken rice for Namakkal district
- Plant100: Green Initiatives to re-establish green belts on lakes, ponds and Govt schools of Cuddalore and Ariyalur district
- Rice Kanchi was supplied to the poor and street inhabitants in all over Tamilnadu with the support of NANABAN Foundation, we supported for it.
- We supported to 75 special need /Cerebral Palsy kids, Devaram mettupatti, Theni District.
- Tribal Welfare for good health and education& Total beneficiaries 145 and Kids 25 women were trained on tailoring, staff salary to IOT training centres, Plant 100 trees at Karunguli Village, Cuddalore Dt
- Alternate Energy Solution for Rural communities Total beneficiaries: 10 villagers at Vadalur Kurinjipadi Tk, Cuddalore Dt

14. Cross cut work

- COVID 19 made most of the people as unemployed and motivated their children to become child labour. NAMCO is one of the members AND District lead in Campaign Against Child Labour (CACL). Under CACL banner, NAMCO did a rapid survey on Child labours in Thiruvarur district in COVID period.
- World AIDS Day observation and awareness programme with the support of IRDRP TRUST-Chennai organized by NAMCO at Thiruvarur for 50 HIV infected people
- CACL prepared election manifesto on Child rights to present to election candidates in Tamilnadu Assembly, 2021. As part the programme, NAMCO gave the manifesto to six election candidates of Thiruvarur district.
- With support of SAVE, Thiruppur, NAMCO organized district level consultation meeting on Local Compliant Committee. In which, District Labour, Educational Department, Child Welfare Committee Chairman and Members, District child Protection officer, Probation officer, Protection Officer (Social welfare)Police officials and staffs of One Stop center, child line, District child protection unit, District social welfare office, NGOs have participated.
